Patient Navigation Critical for Survival in Breast Cancer Treatment: Training Expanded in Botswana



Dr. Carl Swart, a nursing educator and researcher specializing in oncology and palliative care, served as a facilitator on the ethics of being a patient navigator. His expertise helped deepen participants' understanding of ethical principles essential to compassionate and effective patient navigation.

The Botswana-Rutgers Partnership for Health, in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and global partners, has launched a large-scale patient navigation training for breast cancer care, marking a major step toward improving access, coordination, and outcomes for women nationwide. By training twenty-nine nurses and midwives to guide patients through every stage of diagnosis and treatment, the initiative addresses critical gaps that often stand between early detection and survival.
